Overview

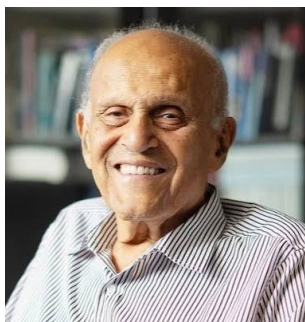
