Thankfully, just two weeks later, I was shortlisted for a role at The University of Salford. This time, I was offered the position of Research Fellow, which changed the trajectory of my career forever.

Working under the mentorship of Professor Peter Brandon was a turning point in my life. His decency, charisma, and leadership inspired me daily. Peter exemplified what it meant to be a leader who valued tolerance and inclusivity. He created an environment where diverse ideas flourished, and his support helped me grow both professionally and personally.
